Conference Theme

This year's theme highlights the essential role community colleges play in expanding opportunity, strengthening local economies, and improving quality of life across Appalachia. We invite proposals that illuminate promising practices, innovative partnerships, and scalable solutions.

Session Format

- Proposals must include a CCA member in the presentation
- 35-minute sessions, including time for Q&A
- Sessions may feature single presenters, co-presenters, or panel-style discussions

Conference Strands

Careers

Sessions in this strand may explore:

- New or redesigned career pathways aligned with regional workforce needs
- Employer partnerships that expand apprenticeships, internships, and work-based learning
- Strategies for engaging adult learners, career changers, and underrepresented populations
- Approaches to rural workforce development that address barriers such as transportation, childcare, or broadband
- Use of labor market data to inform advising, program design, and institutional strategy

Credentials

Sessions in this strand may highlight:

- Stackable credential pathways that lead to family-sustaining wages
- Micro-credentials and short-term training aligned with employer-validated competencies
- Credit for prior learning (CPL) models that accelerate completion
- Noncredit-to-credit alignment and quality assurance practices
- Credential-to-degree pathways that reduce duplication and improve transferability
- Embedding essential skills, digital literacy, and employability competencies into credential programs

Community Impact

Sessions in this strand may feature:

- College-led initiatives that strengthen local economies, health, and civic life
- Programs addressing regional challenges such as addiction recovery, housing, food insecurity, or mental health
- Community-engaged learning models connecting students with local nonprofits and public agencies
- Strategies for building trust and partnerships in rural communities
- Approaches to measuring and communicating institutional impact
- Examples of colleges serving as conveners for regional collaboration and resilience

Proposal Review Criteria

Proposals will be evaluated on:

- Relevance to the conference theme
- Replicability for other Appalachian institutions
- Engagement strategies that encourage interaction and discussion
- Impact on students, institutions, or communities
